FAQ

Who is SIS for?

For people who want or need in training in how to serve Christ cross-culturally, we define as C-3 or C4 missionaries. We often use this scale for defining church workers.

C-1 (culture one) is ministry among people who are of the same language or tribe we are from.

C-2 is ministry who are people who are similar to us, i.e. are of the same nationality but maybe not the same tribe, socio-economics or tribe as us.

C-3 is ministry among people who are different than we are but live in our community (e.g. people from Sudan living in Kenya).

C-4 is ministry to people who live in a different country who's language and customs than ours.

Who is SIS NOT for?

Those serving as pastors working in C-1 or C-2 ministries. This is a missionary training program, not for pastors.

How long is the training program?

This is five-month research training program. There will be a total of five weeks classroom study and three month guided field research curriculum.

What will the student receive in this study?

- Teaching and guidance from an experienced missionary anthropologist who has taught in over 50 countries.

- Notes and materials for study.

Is there a cost for this training?

Yes. A nominal fee to cover lodging and food while in training.
