News from Africa Theological Seminary



ATS Reaching Out With Christ's Compassion

Africa Theological Seminary has been keen to reach out to the local communities in which it is located. Within the last one year, two significant events have made ATS reach and touch our communities in our Kitale and Mt. Elgon Campuses.

1. In ATS Kitale Campus, the Counseling Department was contracted to do Consultancy Services for Kenya Seed Company to determine the "Extent of Drug and Alcohol Abuse" among its employees. Our staff in the Counseling Department did an excellent survey that involved interviewing the staff. The Department is looking forward to holding Seminars as a follow-up to this survey.

2. In Mt. Elgon Campus, ICM/ATS has continued to assist Mt. Elgon people in various ways. In the recent years, our assistance has targeted the victims of land/clan clashes of 2006—2007 that saw thousands displaced from their homes and others maimed or killed. The results of this conflict include increased poverty and numbers of orphans, widows, homeless, and landless people. In January 2010, with the help of one of our key partners, Overseas Council,

ATS launched "Mt. Elgon Compassionate Care Project" to assist Internally Displaced People in Cheptais and Kopsiro divisions. Through this project, we have offered:

- * High School Scholarships to over 14 Orphans
- * Iron Sheets to assist in reconstruction of homes to 42 widows
- * Trauma Counseling seminars have been held that have benefited over 250 affected persons.

We praise God for the opportunity to touch and transform the people of Kitale and Mt. Elgon and make a Christian difference in their lives. We register our heartfelt appreciation to all our partners who make our Compassionate Outreach and Care to the local community possible. ~ Rev. Dr. Emmanuel Chemengich ~
